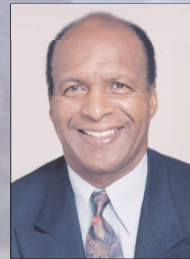




VETERAN DESIGNATION BEGINS JULY 1, 2015

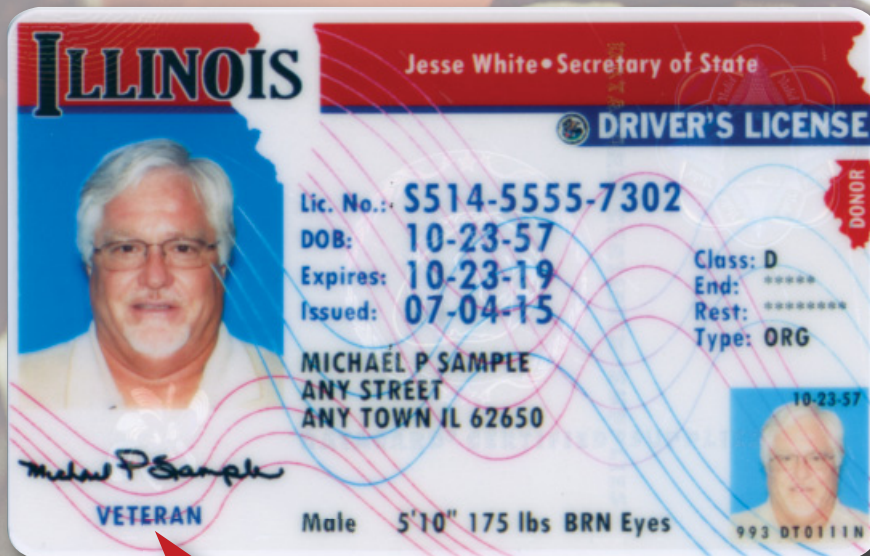

Steps for U.S. military veterans to obtain a veteran designation:

1. Visit an Illinois Dept. of Veterans' Affairs field office and bring a validated copy of a DD-214 or Certification of Military Service (NA Form 13038). 2. Obtain official certification from the Illinois Dept. of Veterans' Affairs field office.
3. Bring certification to any Illinois Secretary of State Driver Services facility.

The designation will come at no additional cost for driver's license and ID card renewals. If veterans choose to add the designation before their scheduled renewal date, they may obtain an updated driver's license for \$5 and an updated ID card for \$10.
